In front of you is the Summer issue of the Bulletin.

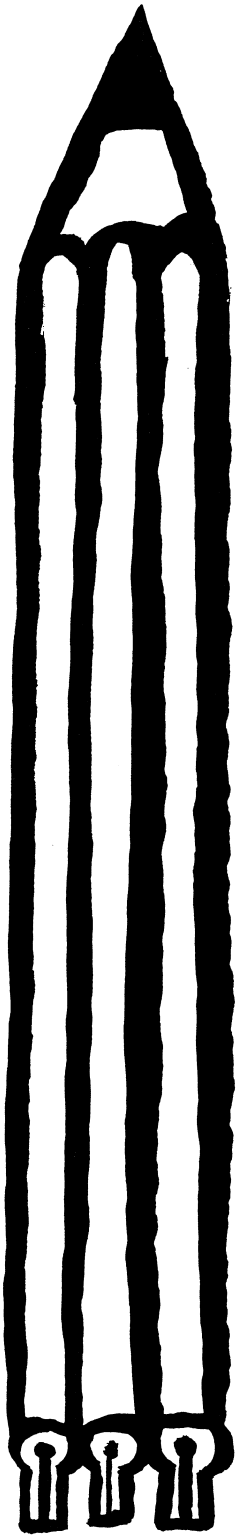
